NOMINEES

1. Person nominated for induction must be a graduate of Industrial/Druid High School and must have graduated from accredited colleges or universities.
2. The nomination is open to any area of specialization.
3. Preference will be given to nominees who are members of the Industrial/Druid Alumni Association, but such membership is not an absolute requirement for nomination. However, once nominated, an individual must join the Alumni Association.
4. Prospective Inductees must be nominated by a **non-relative**. Self-nominations will not be accepted.
5. Any prospective Inductee must have served for a minimum of twenty (20) years in his or her chosen profession, that is, in the field in which he or she is to be recognized.
6. Exceeds expectation for success in a given area as measured by persons who are specialists in that area.

Additional criteria for nomination may include—but are not limited to—the following:

1. Prospective Inductee's contributions to the bettering of humanity and his/her community as measured by awards in a particular field or significant recognition by members of the nominee's chosen profession. Criteria should be measurable, not impressionistic, that is, not simply based on a sense of general like for the individual or a general sense of a broad base of popularity for the individual.

2. Nominating letters may come from any member of the Alumni Association not serving on the Selection Committee or other individuals who have knowledge of the exceptional contributions of the person being nominated.
3. Optional: Points awarded if nominee participates significantly with the graduating class.
4. Optional: Points awarded if recognition/letter of recommendation from graduating class reunion members.

Upon being informed that he or she has been nominated, the prospective inductee must submit the following to the Selection Committee.

1. Proof of graduation from Industrial/Druid High School and proof of graduation from an accredited college or university (*for example, a copy of a diploma*).
2. Three letters of recommendation from persons who have intimate knowledge of the nominee's contributions to his or her field. These experts should be able to comment in detail on the value of the prospective inductee's contributions.
3. A one-page commentary from the prospective inductee on his or her qualifications for induction into the Hall of Fame.
4. A resume—no longer than four (4) pages—in which the prospective inductee highlights relevant achievements.
 5. A sample of his/her work (*a successful grant application, a book, an article, photographs, photographs of paintings, or other relevant samplings*).
 6. The name of an individual who is best qualified to present the nominee and his/her work in a brief introduction at the Awards Ceremony.

SELECTION COMMITTEE

The selection committee will consist of five (5) members of the Alumni Association, with the person selected as Chair having a vote only in cases of a tie. Members of the committee may solicit nominations, but they may not make nominations. They also may not write letters of recommendation for persons under consideration. In instances where relatives of committee members are nominated, committee members affected must recuse themselves from the discussions. The Chair, in consultation with the other members of the committee, will select an Alumni Association member to serve in this particular selection period; the recused member will return to regular duties after the affected selection process is complete. If the Chair is the member affected by nomination of a relative, then a temporary Chair will be determined, and the selection process will proceed as outlined in the previous sentence.
